Private, not-for-profit, coed; Master's Colleges & Universities-Larger Programs

History:

Founded in 1901 as St. Clara College in Sinsinawa, Wisconsin. Moved to River Forest, Illinois in 1922 and renamed Rosary College. Became Dominican University in 1997.

Campus:

The thirty-acre main campus is in River Forest, a residential suburb located ten miles west of downtown Chicago. Classes are also offered at other sites in the Chicago area and on-line.

Library:

The Rebecca Crown Library provides library services to support the academic, resource, and instructional needs of the students, faculty, and staff of Dominican University. As a member of LIBRAS, CARLI (I-SHARE), and RAILS the library is able to provide access to materials from across the state of Illinois. In addition, the Rebecca Crown Library subscribes to over 100 databases providing access to over 30,000 full text journals. Numerous computers, printer/scanners, and access to the wireless network are available throughout the library. Students also have access to several individual and group study rooms, the Noonan Reading Room for quiet study, a quiet contemplation space for reflection, the WeatherTech Innovation Lab & Media Center to design new projects and learn emerging technologies, and a Learning Commons for tutoring and student support services.

Undergraduate Programs:

Several baccalaureate degrees including Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Science in Nursing, Bachelor of Business Administration, Bachelor of Professional Studies, Bachelor of Medical Studies, and Bachelor of Applied Science degrees with over 50 majors, as well as professional and pre-professional programs, including a post baccalaureate pre-medical studies program.

Graduate Programs:

Eighteen graduate degree programs in Business, Education, Library and Information Studies, Social Work, Physician Assistant Studies, Nutrition, Mediation and Conflict Resolution, and other areas.

Faculty:

Full-Time: 152 Instructional, 5 Librarians

Part-Time: 327 (includes 53 administrative and other staff who teach part-time)

Overall Student/Faculty Ratio: 12 to 1

Tuition (2024-2025):

Undergraduate: \$38,328 full-time (\$1,277 per credit hour)

Graduate: \$425 to \$1,010 per credit hour, depending on program Room and Board: \$11,600 (includes meal plan with flex dollars)

Financial Aid (Fall 2024):

100% of all incoming freshmen received some form of financial aid with an average scholarship/grant award of \$30,750. The average total award, including institutional scholarship/grants, federal grants, state grants, work-study and student loans for freshmen is \$37,320.

Ranked by U.S. News and World Report in the top tier (#20) of all Midwestern Master's Universities. Also cited as a "Top performer on Social Mobility", "Best Undergraduate Teaching", and a "Best Value" in the Midwest.
