Greetings from our busy and beautiful River Forest campus, one of two now in Chicagoland with the addition of the Chicago Campus in Pilsen. SOIS is proud to support the Chicago Campus through the cybersecurity pathway in Informatics. Helping establish the new campus and new associate's degree and workforce development certificates there is just one of the many efforts that have kept us busy this academic year. The hard work of faculty seeking outside support is paying off. We're excited to announce that Dr. Cecilia Salvatore and Dr. Tony Dunbar received a \$750,000 Mellon Foundation grant to develop curriculum and provide student internships for cultural heritage preservation work with regional partners. See more in Faculty News below. We're waiting to hear about two more grant efforts. We've also begun work on a museum studies certificate and, in partnership with our sister School of Social Work, on a certificate for library social work. We are also in the midst of developing our new

strategic plan for SOIS, which we'll share with the community this fall.

The hard work is paying off in numbers, as well. Our degree programs are going strong. Enrollments are up 20% this summer and are already up 51% for fall with new applications coming in nearly every day. We are far exceeding our targets, which is testament to the incredible work of our enrollment management team but also to the great work of our faculty and staff and to you, our supportive alumni. Our incoming Follett Chair, Kaetrena Davis Kendrick, remarked to me that with the news of her taking on the Follett Chair came excited congratulations from GSLIS/SOIS alumni who welcomed her and warned her that the work is serious, that our alumni do not mess around!

The amplified thrum of the early cicada broods triggered something in our psyches this spring and summer, surely, but the greater buzz has come from local and world events and an impending election that inspire us to focus even more intently on our work. We are called to prepare our students well and fully to promote the ethics of our profession and fight for intellectual freedom and freedom from manipulation. We appreciate your support in that effort and welcome your feedback on how we're doing. Please enjoy this spring/summer issue of *Off the Shelf*.
