ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Laura Rodríguez Romaní (2017) was teaching third- and fifth-grade dual language classes at Hawthorn Elementary in Vernon Hills when she enrolled in SOIS to seek her school librarian endorsement. Laura and her librarian at Hawthorn knew the challenges of finding quality books in Spanish, especially informational books, for their students. Laura was already accustomed to scouring vendor catalogs looking for new sources of books for Hawthorn students when she saw that SOIS offered a travel course to the Guadalajara International Book Fair. Choosing to take that course set her on a new path that led to small business ownership and attention from major news sources.

After the trip Laura made it her mission to use her new-found resources at the fair to bring high-quality Spanish-language books to the U.S. She imagined herself in a librarian role to do so, but a shortage of library positions and the birth of her son inspired a new idea, an online Spanish bookstore for children's books. Laura launched her store, <u>Los Amigos Books</u>, in 2021. Thanks to the Berwyn Shops retail incubator project, Laura now has a physical store in addition to her online store.

In 2022 Laura joined the American Booksellers Association. Soon after, she was featured in an Associated Press story about the boom of minority-owned bookstores during the pandemic that the *New York Times* and Univision picked up. After all the press she received, her business grew and she is in a great position to fulfill her mission. "I see us growing into a company that has two divisions, the online and physical bookstore for the public that is a community space where parents can find books, educational toys, other related merchandise, and attend Spanish language story times and other special events, and a division that focuses on providing books to schools, public libraries, and other organizations."
